Preach the Word!

In 2 Tim. 4:2, Paul charges Timothy with a joyful and burdensome mission to: "preach the word." This is every true preacher's divine assignment. We must preach the word. Paul also instructed Timothy what to preach. Preach the word. The importance of preaching rests in its content, not in its function. Our preaching is not the reason the word works. The word is the reason our preaching works.

We must preach what 2 Tim. 3:15 calls "the sacred writings." We must preach what 2 Tim. 3:16 calls "all scripture." Did you get that? Preach the Bible, not just your favorite topics or doctrines. Preach it all. Strive to end your ministry with the words of Paul: "I testify that I am innocent of all your blood, for I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:26-27).

Preachers should always be pointing to a text and never remove his finger from the Scriptures. Biblical preaching involves more than reading and quoting verses. Biblical preaching explains what the text means by what it says. 2 Tim. 2:15 exhorts, "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth."

When Paul charged Timothy to preach the word, their preaching focused on the divine person and redemptive work of the Lord Jesus Christ. 1 Cor. 1:23 says, "We preach Christ crucified." And 2 Cor. 4:5 says, "For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake."

Many of Charles Spurgeon's sermons sounded alike. He replied, "And so they should. First I take a text, and then I make a beeline for the cross." Likewise, our preaching should unapologetically focus on the overcoming life of Christ, Christ's death, Christ's victorious resurrection, and the sure return of Jesus Christ's second coming.
