The Heart of Worship

What purposes should worship assemblies serve? First and foremost, the church gathers for worship assemblies on Sunday's with the explicit purpose of focusing on God and putting Him first. That means God is the focal point, not man.

Reverent entry into worship is solely a believer to God activity. Worship is any activity of the spirit or body directed towards God for honor and glory. The primary reason God called us to assemble is for the corporate assembly to worship Him and Him alone.

In Revelation 4:11, the living creatures give glory and honor and thanks to God who sits on the throne, "Worthy are You, our Lord and our God, to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and because of Your will they existed, and were created."

In John 4:24, Jesus instructs that, "God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

Jesus is not referring to the Holy Spirit. He's referring to the human spirit, the part of us God made in His own image for the purpose of having close spiritual communion with Him. Our worship is to be "in spirit" and that means it begins in our spirits, in the "inward man." It cannot be mere external acts; it has to involve rational activity of the mind and the heart. The essence of worship is the heart combined with specific mental activity directed toward God.

Worship is a consciousness or awareness of God's presence, a spirit of reverence or awe in view of His power and glory, an attitude of adoration and love in awareness of His love toward us, a spirit of submission to His law and His will, a sense of peace and joy in contemplation of His grace. This is the heart of worship.
