## The Parable of the Incredible Father June 18, 2023

**Luke 15:1-2,** "Now all the tax collectors and the sinners were coming near Jesus to listen to Him.<sup>2</sup> Both the Pharisees and the scribes began to grumble, saying, "This man (Jesus) receives sinners and eats with them."

Luke 15:11-32, "A man had two sons.<sup>12</sup> The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the estate that falls to me.' So he divided his wealth between them.<sup>13</sup> And not many days later, the younger son gathered everything together and went on a journey into a distant country, and there he squandered his estate with loose living. <sup>14</sup> Now when he had spent everything, a severe famine occurred in that country, and he began to be impoverished. <sup>15</sup> So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, and he sent him into his fields to feed swine. <sup>16</sup> And he would have gladly filled his stomach with the pods that the swine were eating, and no one was giving anything to him. <sup>17</sup> But when he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired men have more than enough bread, but I am dving here with hunger!<sup>18</sup> I will get up and go to my father, and will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in your sight; <sup>19</sup> I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me as one of vour hired men."<sup>20</sup> So he got up and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off. his father saw him and felt compassion for him, and ran and embraced him and kissed him.<sup>21</sup> And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' <sup>22</sup> But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly bring out the best robe and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand and sandals on his feet; <sup>23</sup> and bring the fattened calf, kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; <sup>24</sup> for this son of mine was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.' And they began to celebrate. <sup>25</sup> "Now his older son was in the field, and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. <sup>26</sup> And he summoned one of the servants and began inquiring what these things could be. <sup>27</sup> And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf because he has received him back safe and sound.<sup>28</sup> But he became angry and was not willing to go in; and his father came out and began pleading with him.<sup>29</sup> But he answered and said to his father, 'Look! For so many years I have been serving you and I have never neglected a command of yours; and yet you have never given me a young goat, so that I might celebrate with my friends; <sup>30</sup> but when this son of yours came, who has devoured your wealth with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him.' <sup>31</sup> And he said to him, 'Son, you have always been with me, and all that is mine is yours. <sup>32</sup> But we had to celebrate and rejoice, for this brother of yours was dead and has begun to live, and was lost and has been found.""
