Three Ways Faith Can Die:

1. Spiritual Self-Destruction

2. Slow Starvation

James 2:26, "Faith without works is dead."

Matthew 13:5-6, "Others (seed) fell on the rocky places, where they did not have much soil; and immediately they sprang up, because they had no depth of soil. ⁶ But when the sun had risen, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away."

Matthew 13:20-21, "The man who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; ²¹ yet he has no firm root in himself, but is only temporary, and when affliction or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he falls away."

3. Strangulation by Sin
